The Book Reviews section of *IJSTL* serves as a forum to provide constructive, professional evaluation of the value of newly published books whose major themes are on shipping and transport logistics. The primary objective of the Book Reviews section is to provide critical and comprehensive reviews of recent books from the areas of shipping and transport logistics, as well as those having high relevance to the research, teaching, and practice of shipping and transport logistics from other disciplines of significant interest to the readers of *IJSTL*. Such other disciplines include supply chain management, operations management, organization theory, strategic management, and information technology.

In addition to solicited reviews, we encourage unsolicited reviews in the form of review essays or responses to reviews. A book review should provide a brief descriptive summary of the book's theme, position taken, methodology used, and most importantly, critically explain to *IJSTL*'s readers how well the book addresses theoretical and managerial issues of interest to academics, researchers and practitioners of shipping and transport logistics. The critique should centre on the principal scholarly purposes and merits/demerits of the book.
