Cloud computing was at the forefront of digital transformation in 2017 and the rate of cloud adoption continues to rise in 2018. According to Forrester, the total global public cloud market will be \$178 billion in 2018, up from \$146 billion in 2017. Furthermore, enterprises are considering multi-cloud provider strategies to reduce risk and avoid

vendor lock-in. IDC has forecasted that, by 2020, over 90% of enterprises will use multiple cloud services and platforms.

As cloud becomes mainstream and more data and applications move to the cloud, there is an increased focus on core security practices, DevOps automation, cloud-native application design practices and achieving operational efficiency in a multi-cloud environment. According to Gartner, by 2020, more than 50% of enterprises will run mission-critical, containerised cloud-native applications in production, up from less than 5% today.

Cloud computing also continues to enable innovation and business transformation across industries driven by emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning, virtual and augmented reality, blockchain, edge computing and digital twin, to name a few. Education is no exception; according to MarketsandMarkets, higher education expenditure on cloud-based infrastructure and application services will reach \$2.7 billion by 2021 from \$788 million in 2015, with a CAGR of 22.3%. AI and cloud are enhancing the learning and campuses experiences and enabling dynamic exchanges and participation between faculty, students, and parents, to improve student success and accelerate scientific research.

ICA CON was established to provide the IBM Cloud Academy community with a forum for getting together annually to share global research, experiences and best practices around this transformational and disruptive IT paradigm. The 4th International IBM Cloud Academy Conference (ICA CON 2016) was held in Edmonton, Canada from June 2–3, 2016 on the campus of University of Alberta. The 5th International IBM Cloud Academy Conference (ICA CON 2017) was held in Wroclaw, Poland from May 24–26, 2017 on the campus of Wroclaw University of Science and Technology. The combined conferences brought together over 250 presenters and participants from 30+ countries. There were over 70 oral presentations, numerous poster sessions and featured invited keynote talks by industry and academic experts. These conferences underscore the importance of cloud computing in the education sector.

From ICA CON 2016 and ICA CON 2017, eight papers were selected for this special issue that target the following research issues in cloud computing:

- cloud analytics and IoT platforms for education
- achieving security in cloud and multi-cloud environments
- evaluating performance in the cloud
- achieving isolation in multi-tenant cloud environments.

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
